9. CHAIRMAN'S REPORT
 1) Cllr Couzens is collecting the whips from Wykeham's Trees for planting by Heritage volunteers

2) John Townend MP has been in touch he would like to advertise the fact that Mr Seymours account has been drastically reduced and question his motives.

3) Public Rights of Way had been mentioned on the radio and it was felt that we should look into obtaining a map and update same

4) The Chairman wishes to record congratulations to Cllr Crossland on his recent award from the RNL

5) Cllr Mummery reported on the progress with Woodland Trust - quite a number of people had attended the Meeting and she was pleased to announce that more funds had been received. The launch for pledges etc. will be towards the end of January. She will keep the Council informed of progress.

10. CLERK'S REPORT.

1) Crime Figures for December - 4 Incidents involving youths, 3 incidents of Criminal damage, 8 traffic incidents, 21 other incidents, such as alarm calls etc. A small number of incidents reported this month which is seems would go against our request for a surveillance camera behind the library. When the reply is received from Chief Constable Leonard this matter will be discussed again. Residents are reluctant to report incidents to the police as they are concerned about repercussions. **WE DO NEED PEOPLE TO REPORT INCIDENTS**

2) Details of the amount to be paid to Wildlife Solicitors had been received from the Court amounting to £5228.25 since the cheque had to be paid within 14 days it had been necessary to attend to this matter prior to the meeting. It was resolved that the Clerk had no option but to proceed. A request had been made for an invoice indicating the VAT content for our records. The Clerk had transferred £6000 from the High Interest Deposit account to the Community Account in order to pay the bill. It was resolved that this was in order.

3) Lights in Castle Crescent, Allison Lane and Church Lane had all been mended. A further light down Lighthouse Road has been reported needing attention. Mr Robson of 4 Victoria Terrace had requested removal of the street light attached to the house. The Contractor had asked Mr Robson the tenant to get permission from the Owner for its removal when received Contractor will remove same. At that time consideration will be given to the need, if any, to re-site this lamp. It must be remembered this is a private road.

4) The key to the Notice Board is broken - Cllr Crossland will attend to this matter. More paper has been ordered and the photocopier is in need of attention again. The Clerk to attend to this matter.

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5) One quotation only received for trimming **trees and shrubs on green** - it was resolved to ask the successful tenderer Mr Alan Richardson to proceed as his quotation with regard to the work but, the Chairman and Clerk to liaise with him to final costs working on a basic £8.00 an hour.

11) QUESTIONS

1) Cllr Crossland expressed concern about **large puddles** which are forming outside Copperfields restaurant, Bus Shelter and Post Office corner, also the corner of Woodcock Road. Cllr Hall explained that he has been trying to get results on this problem for 3 years. It was resolved that the Clerk should write to the Chief Executive of East Yorkshire Council expressing our concerns about damage that may be being caused to properties.

2) Cllr Hall expressed concern about the **seat** opposite **Flanaburg Hotel** which is damaged. Cllr Crossland stated he had looked at several seats around the village and thought consideration should be given to stronger seats such as concrete/metal etc., it was resolved that the Clerk gets quotations for seating from Wickstead Leisure for discussion at the next Meeting. Cllr Crossland will remove the broken seat from North Landing Road.

3) Cllr Hall expressed concern that a family in distress 21/22nd December had been unable to get help from the **Social Services Department** - all present felt this was appalling.

4) Cllr Crossland having precummary interest left the Meeting in order that problems being experienced at the **Allotments** could be discussed. It was resolved that a letter be sent to the Contractor asking that the roadway into the allotments and the grass verge be attended to as complaints had been received from allotments holders, and Health and Safety Officers had expressed concern

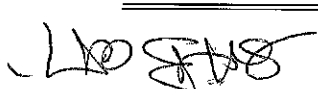

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT - MEETING 1ST FEBRUARY 1999

One or two problems had to be dealt with since the last Meeting:

Jan 8th I received a call from residents overlooking the Telephone Sub-Station regarding the erection of a 40ft mast to improve services at Lissett - **after** the mast was erected a notice inviting complaints was attached to the gates. I spoke to one of the engineers who promised to ask BT's Planning Officer to contact me, which he did the same day. After explaining the concern of local residents regarding exposure to radiation, the unsightly appearance of the mast, also the timescale for considering complaints, I was assured that the danger from exposure to radiation was so small it posed no danger whatsoever, the Officer agreed to look at the possibility of some type of landscaping, with trees to screen off the mast, he also agreed to look at BT's present policy of notices being displayed **after** work had been carried out.

Jan 14th BT's Planning Officer telephoned to tell me plans for landscaping were to go ahead.

Jan 10th I was called out to the North Landing following a complaint of gully waste being discharged on the car park and into the ravine, flowing down a public right of way

Jan 11th complained to Mr J Wheeler Director of Planning Environment and Technical Services - I received a letter the following day to say it appeared "an offence may have been committed". I alerted the Chairman of the North Landing Regeneration Project, Cllr Trevor Pearson who met with Mr Wheeler, I understand engineers were being made to find the culprit perhaps Cllr Pearson may be able to enlighten Members on what progress has been made. I gave Mr John Waud's Secretary a copy of Mr Wheeler's letter for information for Thornwick Camp.

Jan 22nd The bulbs donated by Mr Bayes were planted around the tree of Greenside - Cllr Mummery had arranged with the Headmaster, Mr Harrison to bring children from Flamboyant School to do the planting - it turned out to be a very enjoyable exercise - it was a cold morning but bright and sunny - I would like to suggest a letter of thanks be sent to the school. I would also like to place on record my personal thanks to Cllr Mummery, for her help and support in making the exercise so successful. Dependent on the weather, it is hoped the infilling of the allotment hedge will still take place on Sunday Jan 31st as previously arranged.

2. QUESTIONS BY ELECTORS - Mr Clifford Thomas of 4 St Davids Lane, North Landing, Flamborough asked about parking at North Landing he had heard rumours of a proposed large car park and residents are upset about cars being parked on grass verges. The procedure was explained to Mr Thomas and a reply will be posted to him.

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF MEETING HELD 4th JANUARY 1999

Cllr. Hall wished an alteration he had declared a non-pecuniary interest in item 5 of Clerk's report - alteration approved. Cllr. Crossland wished it to be recorded that he was asked to leave the Meeting. Having not been aware of the subject to be discussed he had not declared his interest. The Chairman indicated that since Cllr Crossland had a definite interest in the matter she had left the item to last and since he would be unable to take part in the discussion had felt it fairer to ask for him to leave.

It was resolved that after amendments made the Minutes be passed as a true record

4. MATTERS ARISING

1) The Clerk has spoken to Janet Boyd of ERYC and the waste paper bin is to be delivered at the end of week commencing 8th February. It was resolved that the problems behind the library are not going away and that we should ask for the glass recycle bin to be removed if the new lockable bin that has been promised for a long time is not available, give a time limit for delivery as the end of February, it was felt although this is a facility for the Village we do need to look after the interests of residents - Clerk to write to Janet Boyd. The Clerk reported on the reply from the Police, a surveillance camera is not available as they are needed for more urgent problems i.e. drugs. PC Noble has been asked to keep a look-out around the Library area and when functions are being held but of course this is only when he is on duty. Cllr Blagborough stressed the importance of neighbourhood watch

2) **Rolling programme** Two more names to be added to those wishing to tender for work

3) **Allotment rents** - all collected. 2 Vacant allotments.

4) **War Memorial Insurance.** Cover increased to £4000 and £2000 as recorded. Charge by Zurich is being waived.

5) **Zurich Insurance and injured horse** - The Clerk reported on reply to query of work carried out and legality of railings used.

6) **Forms for Small Grants** - forms very difficult to complete.

7) Thanks were expressed to **Cllr Couzens** for collecting the whips from Scarborough for the allotment hedge.

8) **Plan of Rights of way** has been obtained - grants are available for work. Cllr

Mummary will look into this matter

She expressed concern that the Bridle-path did not appear to be indicated. Cllr Hall stressed the advantages of being a Heritage Coast.

9) Cllr Crossland reported no reply from the owner of 4 Victoria Terrace about the street light. Resolved to give until end of month for a reply - further discussion at next Meeting.

10) Resolved that Cllr. Crossland will repair the Notice Board.

11) Trees and shrubs on green and Camerons Gardens We have received a firm quotation from Alan Richardson of £240 - we have been informed we need permission from the Trees Officer before work can be done in a Conservation Area. An application form has been completed but permission has been refused. The Tree Officer would like to meet Mr Richardson and look at what could be done it was resolved to ask Mr Richardson to arrange this - obviously Mr Richardson will charge the Council for his time.

12) Large puddle problem has been resolved with help from Mr Wheeler of ERYC after contact by Cllr Hall and a follow up letter from the Clerk - however, waste had been deposited over the cliff at North Landing. Cllr Pearson had contacted Mr Wheeler and after prolonged discussions it is hoped this will not happen again and arrangements have been made for the rubbish to be cleared away by ERYC. Correspondence in connection with the rubbish tipping has been passed to Thornwick Camp for their interest.

13) "Waterboard" seat it was felt we could not ask for a replacement - prices of new stronger seats have been received from various suppliers Cllr Blagborough and Cllr Mummery will conduct a survey of all seats and lights and report back to the next Meeting. Cllr Hall proposed we adopt a policy, i.e. we take the repair of each seat individually on merit - it is felt a bench would be suitable at the site opposite the Flaneburg Hotel.

5. CORRESPONDENCE.

1) Letter received from Ladies Lifeboat Guild asking to hold Street Market in Camerons Gardens in August. Resolved permission granted so long as organisers arrange their own public liability insurance.

2) Footpath No. 3 Closure - renewal of 6 monthly permission

3) Letter received in connection with parking at South Landing - plan received indicating, parking permit area, lifeboat crew area and new disabled parking area. Clerk to acknowledge saying contents of letter have been noted.

6. PLANNING APPLICATIONS

K 1541(B) Alteration and extension to existing storeroom to form new office - Flamborough Victoria Institute - separate letter received showing change to windows. It was resolved no reservations to make other than stress consideration must be given to retaining right of way to service properties in Victoria Terrace.

7. PLANNING DECISION

K 1341(J) The Grange, Bampton Lane PERMISSION GRANTED with requested restrictions applying.

8. HEDGE MATTERS

1) Whips had been planted by Heritage Coast Volunteers and some Councillors on Sunday 31st January 1999 - a letter should be sent to Mr Dawson thanking him for organising his volunteers etc., whips on the other side of the allotment site are growing well and it is hoped this year we should see some improvement in appearance. Cllr Major proposed the yellow door should be removed as it looks unsightly. It was resolved to ask for quotation to place iron gates stored at Cllr Crosslands house on the Camerons Gardens site, and use one of the gates from Camerons Gardens on the allotment site. Clerk to obtain quotations for the next Meeting. Cllr Hall wished it to be recorded that he recommended the gate should be removed, the ground banked up and whips planted to close this access completely.

2) We are awaiting a date for Meeting with our legal advisor before the Affidavit question can be answered. An extra meeting is to be called once this information is to hand as we have now received the account from Pinkney Marshall.

3) **Village circular** - it was felt an item in the Bridlington Free Press had cancelled the need for a circular.

4) Cllr Newlove felt we should ask **John Towend** to publicise Mr Seymours account as suggested but this had been covered by the same item in the Free Press. Send copy of item in current issue of Free Press to Mr Towend.

5) It was resolved that we should cancel our Membership of the **Country Landowners Association**.

9. REPORT FROM COUNCIL NOMINEES

1) **Woodland Trust** Cllr Mummery reported that all pledge letters had now been distributed and that further pledges amounting to £2000 had been received.

10. CHAIRMANS REPORT

1) Had received a call from residents overlooking the Telephone Sub-Station regarding the erection of a 40ft mast to improve services at Lissett - **after the mast** was erected a notice inviting complaints was attached to the gates. The residents were concerned regarding exposure to radiation. She had contacted officers concerned assurance was given with regard to radiation and BT have promised to landscape the area. The residents had expressed satisfaction at the outcome.

2) The bulbs donated by Mr Bayes had been planted around the trees on Greenside - a letter of thanks should go to the School and the Chairman thanked Cllr Mummery for all her hard work in this respect.

11. CLERKS REPORT

1) Spoken to Adrian Dawson of Heritage Coast. responsibility of steps at North Landing is that of the owner of the land. Cllr Crossland wanted clarification of this matter as he felt other steps etc., put in place by the Heritage Coast were covered by them and not the landowner. Clerk to seek clarification.

2) Street lights in Allison Lane reported out of order had been repaired by the Contractor. Cllr Crossland reported that vandals had damaged the door which covers the electrical connections he had made it as secure as possible. It was resolved if for the safety of the public the column needed changing then he should proceed.

3) Quotations for notices on allotment site had been received amounting to £46.00 plus VAT. it was resolved to proceed

4) The Clerk reported on balances held in the Bank Accounts.

12. QUESTIONS

1) Cllr Pearson reported on problems with standing water on a dangerous bend down **Lighthouse Road**. Cllr Couzens reported that he had dug out the offending area in the past day or two and the problem was resolved. Thanks were expressed to Cllr Couzens.

2) Cllr Hall reported that residents down **North Marine Road** are very concerned about parking at that end of the Village - this matter has been raised in Electors questions it was resolved that we write to ERYC and ask for signs "NO PARKING ON GRASS VERGES" be erected and reply to Mr Thomas informing him of all our negotiations with ERYC.

3) Cllr Crossland stressed the need for an extra meeting when we have a reply from our legal advisors, he is concerned that **Villagers should be kept informed**

4) Cllr Newlove referred to a letter in the Bridlington Free Press, the Chairman advised that she intended replying to same as a individual Councillor **not** as Chairman of the Parish Council

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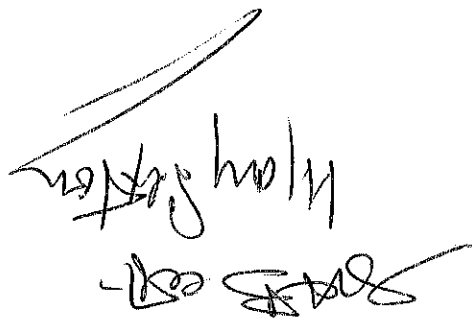

Perhaps Members of Council will consider a limited figure to be spent to allow some of the work to be started immediately.

The Clerk has been advertising for quotes for some of this work.

It's a pity the Police Department regard problems to the rear of the library as of little importance as compared with drugs, etc. Any nuisance is a police matter - many of the youngsters causing the problems are well known to the local P.C., they are well aware of when he is on duty in the Village, with the limited time given to policing the village one can't expect the nuisance to be resolved. I don't think we should let the Police Authority "off the hook" so lightly - the suggestion of a surveillance camera was to help with the policing of that area - I feel we should write again to say we are not satisfied with their reply to the problems and ask what they suggest, removal of the bins is not the answer.

The bins are well used by the Villagers, in the long term they cut down any excuse for dumping waste in the Village.

I have received a letter from B.T's Planning Officer with a copy letter he sent to residents affected by the erection of the 40ft mast at the telephone sub-station, it included a sketch plan of the proposed landscaping also suggestions for trees suitable for the site - the residents I have spoken to seem very happy with the scheme.

I wonder whether Members have considered whether the Council should be seen to be preparing something to celebrate the Millennium in some form or other

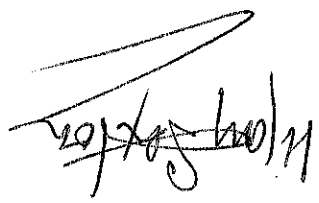

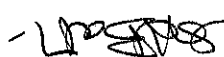

REPORT OF MEETING HELD WITH MR PAUL CROSSLAND AND MR JOHN CROSSLAND Tuesday 15th June 9.30 a.m. on site.

Original work was to create chevron car parking area for approximately 6 cars on hard standing with a 3' high mound on the south side so as to mark the boundary.

Turn over and deep rotavate the entire old bowling club site including the "L" shaped piece adjoining Beech Grove with tractor and rotavator to leave the site level and ready for grass.

Price quoted and accepted by Council £175. 00

Paul indicated on his quotation that some stone would be required but could not be estimated until the soil was removed.

Paul Crossland met with Mrs Sexton Saturday 12th September to discuss further work. He was advised this would need Council approval.

This extra work involved removing small roadway on the edge of the bowling area and ploughing in with the main site to be grassed down.

Removing 2 banks and rotavating Mr Jennings allotment to bring that into the main area.

Dig out to a width of 10' and 18" deep, fill with rubble and 'blind' with chalk stone, form a roadway on the back of Mr Moses's and other allotment.

This estimate was for £200.00 and was approved by Council.

Again Mr Crossland indicated that additional stone would be required.

CURRENT POSITION Mr Crossland received two deliveries of rubble FREE OF CHARGE unfortunately not enough to finish the back end of the roadway or deepen/straighten the chevron parking area. He has taken delivery of some stone which will cost the Council approximately £350 this has levelled off the roadway considerably. He anticipated receiving again FREE OF CHARGE plainings from roadworks carried out by ERYC - one delivery of these plainings had been received this morning. He would spread these plainings over the roadway and the parking area always of course providing enough are received. He would need to charge labour only for this work.

1) Bank of soil to the left of the roadway - Paul was told that this soil could stay, bearing in mind some was already in position from previous workings. He will remove same if required at extra cost but feels now is the wrong time having regard to allotment holders.

2) Bottom end of roadway this could be left in the hopes that more FREE OF CHARGE rubble was available in the future, I understand if we have enquiries for allotments No 13 is available and people would be offered plots down this bottom end, is it likely that many plots will be demanded at this time of year, can we afford to wait for this free rubble?

3) If plainings continue to arrive Mr Crossland will spread them over the Car park first, making it deeper and more clearly defined and then use others on the roadway. There is plenty of firm turn round space for cars to the left of the gateway

4) Grass Verge - Mr Crossland will put some more soil on this area and spread it around, he will also gather up the small amount of stones which are lying to the side of the path. Mrs Sexton has asked Mr John Robson to provide a 'DO NOT PARK' sign to place on this area. Mr John Crossland has indicated that over a period of time it may be possible to receive help from Highways in tidying up the entrance way to the allotments - but has asked that we leave negotiations with him. You will appreciate any barriers put up to prevent parking also prevent Highways cutting grass and into hedge bottoms ALL FREE OF CHARGE

SUMMARY - I appreciate that you will be disappointed in some aspects of this report but I feel that the sudden appearance of some plainings has improved our position. I feel that the amount of work done to date is worth the £375.00 agreed (at todays prices). The extra stone has been unavoidable

Mr Crosslands tipper is being repaired but he anticipates its return this week

I am extremely concerned that if Mr Paul Crossland is asked to leave the site that we will have more expenditure to meet. I feel we need to give more detailed job specifications from the outset. Perhaps some of our new Councillors will be able to help with that in the future.

Some of the large protruding bricks will be removed by hand as the topping is put down on the roadway

Some fly tipping has taken place i.e. pipes, propane gas cylinder, refrigerator etc.

Clr Ray Allerston inform me that plainings are in plentiful supply at Lissett but of course transport costs are high

Perhaps you will be good enough to let me have your instructions bearing in mind extra costs as indicated.

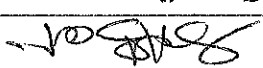

MINUTES OF MEETING OF THE FLAMBOROUGH PARISH COUNCIL HELD AT THE W.I. HALL, THE GREEN, FLAMBOROUGH ON MONDAY 5th JULY 1999 at 7.30 p.m.

PRESENT: Cllr Mrs Sexton (Chairman), Cllr R Allerston (Vice-Chairman), Cllrs J Crossland, R W Emmerson, Mrs L Gibbon, Mrs M P Major, Mrs M A Newlove (part of the meeting), E B Dunn, R Griffin, Mrs M Stafford, Cllr. C R Harrap in attendance

At the start of the Meeting the Chairman asked the Clerk to explain the situation with regard to declaring interest - any Member with an interest in an item to be discussed should declare that interest and must neither take part in the discussion nor vote on the matter. The Clerk keeps a list of such declarations. Any Member with a continuing interest which may affect several meetings should put their interest in writing to the Clerk. The Chairman reminded Members that non-declaration is a criminal offence.

Mr D C Whelpton who was to make his declaration of acceptance of office at the start of the Meeting had unfortunately been unable to attend due to a sudden family commitment. He would therefore sign his declaration before or at the next Meeting.

1. Apologies - Cllr Hall, Mr D Whelpton.

2. Questions by electors - none

3. Minutes of Meeting held 7th June 1999 where approved as a correct record with an alteration requested on item 14 (Questions) - Cllr Crossland raised the query not Cllr Hall and the word will should be altered to does. The Clerk explained the Chairman intends to keep a record of her private calls she will take the total of these calls off her telephone account. She will then pass the account to the Clerk for reimbursement

4. Matters arising

1) Street cleaner was concerned that when his bins are removed he will be required to take all his rubbish into Bridlington this will reduce the amount of time he can spend actually sweeping the streets. No reply had been received from Mr Clarvis in connection with NO FLY TIPPING Notices. Concern was expressed about the amount of rubbish being illegally dumped elsewhere

2) Cost of supplying light in Victoria Terrace will be sent to Clerk by YE. The light would be position about 1/3rd down Terrace from the Victoria Club end

3) No reply received from Mr Warburton of Yorkshire Wildlife.

4) Parking in Danes Dyke bus stop Cllr Crossland reported that PC Noble had been unable to issue fixed penalty notices under the Road Traffic Act until a clearway has been introduced. Letter had been received from Colin Stephenson stating that this clearway along the length of the lay-bye is to be attended to. During the interim period PC Noble has permission to issue fixed penalty tickets. PC Noble will also keep checking the Bus Shelter and behind the library as requested.

5) Cllr Emmerson had replaced the damaged tyre on the swings on the Village Green. Cllr Crossland had repaired the basketball net only for it to be damaged immediately. He had obtained a stronger one from the Sports Hall in Bridlington and erected same.

of outstanding account. This had been forwarded to Miss Lancaster with covering letter asking for any news for this Meeting. No reply received.

6) Legal Matters - the Clerk had received reminder notice from Pinkney and Marshall asking for any news for this Meeting. No reply received.

7) Goalposts on Village Green will be erected in the next ten days. Members queried the charges as listed on "accounts for payment" being different to the estimate given. It was explained that the difference was the VAT and the amount they were looking at was gross.

8) Numbers for Village seats have now been received and sign on Parish Notice Board has been completed. Cllr Crossland will replace seats at War Memorial shortly along with sign in memory of Mr Wall for the Village green.

9) Grass cutting contract and street lighting contract will be returned to Clerk duly signed together with photocopy of Mr Crossland's insurance certificate.

10) Clerk had attended Parish Councils Liaison Meeting. Members of East Riding Council were introduced by Mr O'Connor they spoke of their individual responsibilities, opportunity was given for matters to be discussed with these officers. A useful meeting.

11) Arrangements have been made for Mr Burnhill to talk with some members about Yorkshire in Bloom 2000. Tuesday 19th October 1999 at 7.00 p.m.

12) Letter had been sent to Forreshores Officer with regard to pipe at South Landing. Mr Les Robson had been in touch indicating that he is now attending to this matter (ownership of pipe is still being clarified)

13) War Memorial - Cllr Crossland will provide pin to allow gates to close. Concern was expressed about the arrangements for gardening in general. It was resolved to seek tenders for a gardener to tidy Cameron Gardens, the garden by the Fisherman's Memorial and also War Memorial once a fortnight until the end of the growing season. Notices to be placed in Parish Notice Board when tenders are received opening to be attended by a quorum of Councillors and the successful tenderer to be notified.

14) Cllr Crossland will report on Gas light in Cameron's Gardens at the next Meeting.

The Clerk reported on other printed matters that had been received.

6. Planning Applications

a) K2110(D) Little Swiss Cottage, Greenside - extension to bungalow - no reservations to make.

b) K942(F) Flamborough Head Golf Club - New halfway house - no reservations to make.

Residents had expressed concern to Councillor Dunn about a Ships container which has been placed on property down South Sea Road - Clerk to check on legislation in this respect i.e. is planning permission required?

7. Planning Decisions - none received.

8. Millennium Plans - Cllr Crossland presented plans of the "Flagpole" together with details of how it would be fixed to the ground and how the pulley system would work for raising and lowering the flag. The cost will be £4,200.00. plus perhaps some extra cost for concrete when a structural engineer has worked out how much base is required for the weight/height of the structure. It was resolved to put the plans in the Library for inspection asking for comments from Parishioners if no adverse comments are received in two weeks the Clerk to place the order with the designer.

Funding from "Festival Awards for all" would not be available but other funding is being sort. It was resolved that the Council could underwrite the project and if necessary events organised

to reimburse the Council. There is a possibility of Art award or Tourism award and perhaps Leader II (part funding) It would be necessary if going for an Art or Tourism award to write a "story" of the maritime history of the Village which is being commemorated in this way.

9. Chairman's Report - Complimentary comments received with regard to tidying up of the Village - such as painting of seats, painting of railings etc. During the month the Chairman had been invited to judge a talent competition of the Junior Youth Club she had been surprised at the young talent we have at Flamborough.

An incident at the allotments had been reported it was resolved that since PC Noble had been made aware of the incident the Council could not act as Judge and Jury and should wait until the September Meeting before taking action. It may be the allotment agreement for the individual concerned should not be renewed in November.

10. Reports from nominees/Members with particular interest.

a) School Governors - Cllr Gibbon gave a full report on school activities and the school curriculum and progress being made. There are 141 children at the school increasing to 148 in a few weeks. 16 Children will be transferring to Secondary Education and 16 children will be starting in September. Sporting activities have been excellent with the 6 a-side-football team winning the East Riding schools tournament. The Staff and Governors had attended a drugs awareness session and girls in years 5 and 6 had received education on feminine hygiene (with parental consent). Pupils have attended swimming lessons and taken cycle proficiency certificates - school outings are taking place in the summer term.

b) Planning - nothing to report

c) Conservation - Cllr Griffin reported that English Heritage had stepped in with regard to the planning application to demolish Church Farm - Rule PPG15 was introduced - the position is now that the Owner has to prove that he has tried to sell the property before demolition can proceed - this will obviously cause a delay.

d) Village Hall - refurbishment is now complete. Letter had been received from the Church Council stating that they will be unable to run the Youth Club for the Senior children following an incident - this means a booking is lost. Resolved a letter be sent thanking all the Committee Members for the hard work carried out in making a Hall that we can all be proud of.

e) Village Green - dealt with under matters arising nothing further to report. See if the football goalposts when erected ease the problems with youths.

f) Finance - Cllr Gibbon asked that street lighting bills should be received quarterly. Grass cutting bill should be received quarterly (The Clerk was unaware that these questions were to be asked)

g) War Memorial - attention is required to fencing at front - some red oxide paint is showing. Cllr Crossland will look into this matter. Chairman had cleared all weeds away from newly planted trees it had taken most of a day.

11. Clerk's Report

a) Casual Vacancy - Notice had been posted in notice board allowing 10 parishioners to demand an Election. This option has been taken up. An Election will now be held on Thursday 29th July 1999. We have two nominations. Mr Gordon Scroston and Mrs Mary Robson. A telephone vote had been taken as to whether we required polling cards to be sent out which would bring the cost of the election to £1000 or did we want to waive this, which would mean our costs would be less. The majority decision was to waive having poll cards sent out. The Electoral Officer was informed.

b) Mr Don Newlove and written thanking the Council for their card and gift during his illness

c) An open Meeting is to be held on Thursday 8th July in the Village Hall to present the report commissioned by the North Landing Steering Committee for the regeneration of North Landing.

12. Questions

a) Will the Council please write to the developer at Church Farm asking that the building is left more secure at night as concern is expressed about children playing on site when the Builders have left at night. Resolved that a letter should go to Kemps of Hornsea.
b) No waiting post outside Bakery has been broken - it is now laid in Ship Car Park. Clerk to inform ERBC.
c) Dead tree on roadside opposite Links - present a hazard in a storm. Clerk to contact Chris Mead.

d) Tree cut down by Council on Constable Road at the requests of a resident - it is felt other residents will ask for trees to be removed. Felt the stump left is dangerous - Clerk to inform Council of our concerns.
e) Car Park for bungalows Constable Close/Constable Road needs weeding - bottle parties being held.
f) Concern was expressed that barbed wire has been used on the fence at Danes Dyke Clerk to make enquiries
g) Concern was expressed about possible re-development on the land next to the old chapel on Chapel Street with regard to trees being removed. Nothing the Council can do at the present time.

h) North Star Hotel asked Council to reconsider the position of yellow lines on North Marine Road - unable to change position, this matter had been dealt with earlier in the year and the owner of the North Star had been made aware.

13. Accounts for payment

Councillor Crossland left the Meeting.
Accounts passed for payment with the exception of account for work at the allotments which is to be withheld - this matter will be discussed under the next item.
£20.00 had been paid to Mr John Robson for re-numbering allotments

14. Allotments

It was resolved that in the opinion of the Council the work at the allotments had not been completed and therefore the bill cannot be paid. It is, therefore, considered that all the work mentioned in the report issued with the Agenda should be included in the costs already

charged.
Resolved grass cutting and street lighting tenders be renewed and set time laid down with regard to duration This should be done prior to next years precept being set.
Cllr Allerston requested that the Clerk should create a form which would be available at Meetings so that if Cllr Crossland or any other Councillor agreed to carry out work for the Council at a Meeting he should sign this "Contract" stating the cost and also completion date. Cllr Allerston felt that if this "Contract" was not honoured payment could be withheld. No resolution was passed on this matter. Cllr Allerston queried costs of goalposts with regard to erecting - are we to receive extra costs - Cllr Crossland had indicated at tonight's Meeting that erecting costs would not be charged.

The Clerk reported on the matter raised following Mays Meeting - permission had been given at the Meeting for Paul Crossland to grow vegetables for selling on the land which had been allocated for the proposed bowling club but following the Meeting it had been suggested this could not be allowed. Questions had been raised at County Hall and commercial growing is not allowed. When reported back to Cllr Crossland he indicated that planning permission had been granted following correspondence with the Secretary of State for the bowling club

therefore this land was no longer allotment land. Correspondence with the Secretary of State had been found and telephone contact made. The application was five years old and had been scrapped - the Clerk was referred back to our own Planning Department. They informed that the planning application for change of use to a Bowling Club had been withdrawn by this Council. Therefore, the land was still allotment land. If in the future we wished to consider similar change of use the same procedure can be gone through. We would just need to prove we had tried to let the land for allotments and that we did still have some land available for allotments if so required, and seek approval from the Secretary of State.

**MINUTES OF EXTRAORDINARY MEETING OF FLAMBOROUGH
PARISH COUNCIL HELD MONDAY 9TH AUGUST 1999 AT THE WILLY,
THE GREEN FLAMBOROUGH COMMENCING AT 7.30 p.m.**

Those Present: Cllrs Mrs M Sexton (Chairman) R Allerston (Vice-Chairman), J A Crossland, R W Emmerson, E B Dunn, R A M Griffin, N Hall, Mrs M P Major, Mrs M A Newlove, G Scrowston, Mrs M Stafford, D C Whelpton, Cllr C R Hartrap and J Wilkinson in attendance. Mr S A Bath (Clerk)

Apologies: NONE

This was the first Meeting attended by Cllr D C Whelpton his Acceptance of Office had been signed prior to the Meeting. Cllr G Scrowston was welcomed and signed his Acceptance of Office at this meeting

A member of the public entered the Hall, the Chairman went to speak to him saying that unfortunately since this was an extraordinary Meeting he would be unable to remain.

When all Members had settled down the Clerk reported that at 5.35 p.m. that afternoon as the Chairman was leaving her house following a North Landing Meeting she handed the Clerk a "petition" signed by 8 Councillors invoking standing order no. 11 and indicating that Miss Victoria Lancaster of Lancaster, Phillips and Jones Solicitors was going to speak. The Clerk had checked legislation and was not sure that it was permissible i.e. to move to suspend standing orders at the Meeting, the Clerk thought standing order No. 9 which requires an intended motion to be given in writing 9 days prior to the Meeting would be involved. However, the Chairman and Vice-Chairman said this was not a motion and they intended to continue with the Meeting with the Agenda laid down in the petition and that Miss Lancaster would arrive at 8 o'clock. The Clerk thought it was important to bring this to the attention of all those present as this new move apparently completely invalidated the Meeting requested in the first instance.

The Member of the Public referred to above returned to the Meeting saying he had every intention of stay for the Meeting. The Chairman stated we would not be able to hold the Meeting because Mr Colin O'Connor had said it is laid down in standing orders that at an extraordinary Meeting the press and public should be excluded. Cllrs Crossland and Cllr Hall queried this statement. Cllr Hall asked if Mr O'Connors guidance had been in writing or over the telephone, the Chairman replied "over the telephone but that she took the matter down in writing and read it back to Mr O'Connor each time". Cllr Hall said we are not discussing contracts, or what we are paying people and he felt it was not necessary to exclude public. Cllr Dunn stated that we should all be involved with the discussion of contracts that was what this meeting was all about people getting contracts or not getting contracts. It was necessary to remind Cllr. Dunn that there are two items only on the Agenda as laid down.

The Chairman said Mr O'Connors words were "due to the sensitive nature of the business of this Meeting that we must exclude the press". The Clerk reminded the

Chairman that she should ask the council if they wanted the press to be excluded. A recorded vote was requested. Cllrs Allerton, Dunn, Emmerson, Mrs Stafford, Mrs Major, R A M Griffin, and Mrs L Gibbon voted for the press to be excluded. Cllrs Hall, Crossland Mrs Newlove, G Scrowston and D Whelpton voted against exclusion. Majority in favour therefore, the member of public was asked to leave.

The Clerk asked the Chairman to inform the Meeting of the new "petition", Cllr Dunn suggested the Clerk should be quiet and give the Chairman chance to explain. The Chairman went on to say "This is the procedure Mr O'Connor has advised her to follow, records of the Meeting must be brief and cover only the items that are resolved. Any discussion or statement will be regarded as an exempt item and will be recorded separately and not available to press or public". On item 2 of the Agenda - Solicitors account - Miss Lancaster has offered at no cost to this Council to clarify the point also to give Members an update on the current position. A request by 8 Members for the suspension of standing orders is allowed. Miss Lancaster will arrive at 8.00 p.m. In order to have an orderly Meeting let only one Member at a time speak and as a matter of courtesy will Members address each other as Councillor as laid down in the Local Government Act.

She then turned to the Clerk to make a statement (this is an exempt item and is recorded separately.)

Before making her statement the Clerk asked for a show of hands in view of the Chairman having stated that she rang all Councillors for their opinion of the change of date of this Meeting, she had suggested the majority wanted it changed to Monday. Cllrs Allerton, Mrs Emerson, Mrs Major, E B Dunn and Mrs Stafford raised their hands. Just 5 Councillors from a total of 13. The Chairman did suggest she knew it was more convenient for Cllrs Mrs Gibbon even though she had been unable to speak to her as she was on holiday.

Mr O'Connor had advised The Clerk that she could if she wished make a statement but that she should not be expected to answer questions but that the Chairman should be prepared to answer questions.

After making her statement the Clerk had to leave due to a prior commitment.

Clls G Scrowston was nominated as the person to continue with taking minutes.

Cllr Hall wanted to be sure that full Minutes are taken the Chairman once again indicated that the Minutes should be brief and not available for press and public. Exempt items should be recorded separately. Cllr Mrs Newlove insisted that minutes should be taken as confusion had arisen of the guidance given by Mr O'Connor. The Chairman reported that Mr O'Connor had also reported this matter to Mr Darryl Stephenson the Chief Executive of East Riding of Yorkshire Council.

Cllr Hall expressed concern that we have lost 2 Clerks in 14 months under the same Chairman. For the Clerk to have given her reasons for leaving as her inability to work the the Chairman, we need to be sure we are not in the same difficulty again.

Cllr. Allerston said that at every Meeting the Chairman gives a report and the Clerk gives a report but at no time has the Clerk reported any difficulties. Cllrs Mrs Newlove said that is what the Clerk is doing now.

The Chairman said at the end of the Meeting held 7th July 1999 there had been a "nasty incident" between Cllr Allerston and the Clerk. The Clerk had indicated she would be giving in her notice. The Clerk had rang the Chairman the following day to say she would give the proper notice and work the proper notice and wished to be free of the post by the end of August 1999.

Cllr Newlove asked the Chairman if she had any points to make following the Clerks statement. The Chairman said she had no comments. Cllrs Newlove said we must, therefore, assume what the Clerk has said is true. The Chairman retorted she had nothing to add.

Miss Lancaster joined the Meeting.

Cllr Hall asked for clarification to who had asked Miss Lancaster to attend, bearing in mind the Chairman had been told she must not approach Miss Lancaster herself. She replied 8 Members of the Council had requested suspension of standing orders to allow Miss Lancaster to attend. Cllr Hall asked for the names to be recorded. They are Clls. Mrs Sexton, R Allerston, R W Emmerson, E Dunn, Mrs M Stafford, Mrs M Major, Mrs L Gibbon, D C Whelpton.

Miss Lancaster was then asked to speak to the Meeting, she spoke for approximately 40 minutes giving details of declaratory orders how she felt Mr Button had not acted in the best interests of the Council and although she had written to Mr Goodall of Pinkney Marshall she had not received a reply. As the Council are aware Mr Button has left.

She did not supply the Council with her costs to date as requested in April 1999

Miss Lancaster left the Meeting. Cllr Newlove asked that the Meeting return to Item 1 of the Agenda.

After a short space of time the Chairman said she felt all questions were being targeted at her personally and closed the Meeting.

STATEMENT MADE BY THE CLERK MRS SHEILA BATH AT EXTRAORDINARY MEETING HELD 9TH AUGUST 1999 AT 7.30 p.m.

I do hope you are all aware of the legislation that has allowed this Meeting to be convened. Local Government Act 1972 Schedule 12 Part 11 No. 9 allows for 2 or more Councillors to write and ask the Chairman to call an extraordinary meeting within 7 days. This notice was served at 2.00 p.m. on Sunday 1st August 1999 suggesting Friday 6th August at 7.00 p.m. However, the Chairman notified the Clerk at 6.30p.m. on Monday 2nd August, this did not allow the statutory 3 clear days to allow a Friday Meeting - she also informed the Clerk that she had rang most of the Councillors and the majority considered Monday 9th August more convenient. As you can see by the way I am dressed it was not convenient for me as I am due for dinner at 8 o'clock at RYVC dressed as a Jackard (I am assured this is a common sailor).

MY RESIGNATION

I began feeling concerned ironically when the Chairman gave me her first itemised phone bill, she had written against various calls Lancaster, Phillips and Jones (in Aug, Sept and Oct 1998).

At an extraordinary Meeting held 27th August 1998 it was resolved to ask the Parish Councils Assn for help
Help was not forthcoming as we had already instructed a Solicitor, but at our monthly Meeting 2nd November 1998 Cllr Newlove and Clls Crossland asked for a full Council Meeting to be called before a decision to instruct, Lancaster, Phillips and Jones was made. This decision was made on the 26th April 1999.
As you are aware the Chairman passed, 3 letters to the Clerk at a Monthly Meeting these letters were from Lancaster, Phillips and Jones and addressed to Mrs Sexton and had not been seen by the Clerk - if during the course of these months I queried the Chairman acting on her own she said she had rang the Vice-Chairman got his permission and that is all she needed.

Following our Meeting of 10th May I had cause to ring officers of East Riding C.C. about our decision to allow Paul Crossland to grow vegetables on the allotment. Two officers asked why I was ringing when they had already gone to great lengths explaining to our Chairman. This I consider a gross waste of my time and that of the Officers I had spoken to the Chairman each day that week and not once did she mention her phone calls.

At our Meeting held 7th June it was resolved that the Clerk should meet with Paul Crossland at the allotments in an effort to speed the job along. In the evening following the meeting I received a phone call from the chairman telling me the vice-Chairman was going to dictate a letter to me which I had to post to Mr Crossland I pointed out that since this was not as resolved at our meeting I felt unable to oblige. Next morning I received a phone call from the Chairman informing me that the Vice-Chairman said I must not meet Mr Crossland on my own The Chairman and Vice-Chairman should be present. However, when a time was arranged both had other engagements.

Now to our Meeting of 5th July 1999 it was obvious in my opinion that Councillors had been sounded out and indeed asked to raise certain questions. But it ended up like facing a firing squad with the victim absent.

I was asked to read out legislation with regard to interest, but you will recall 2 Meetings ago copies of these rules had been circulated and a copy give to our new Councillors when they signed their Acceptance of Office.

A request was made to change the minutes with regard to questions of the Chairman's telephone account. Cllr Hall deleted and Cllr Crossland inserted. In my opinion both had expressed grave concern as well as Cllr Newlove, however, Cllr Crossland bemusedly accepted blame.

Having gone to a lot of trouble over recent Meetings to sort out our "interest" difficulties and having been told to talk to Paul Crossland only we find one Councillor asking Cllr Crossland to ask his son to send 1/4 quarterly bills in for grasscutting 1. In view of all the previous discussion how can that be? Incidentally I have indicated on the Minutes that the 2 questions asked at this point were done so without the Clerks knowledge. Had I been informed I would of suggested neither question should of been asked.

We then come to the end of the Meeting when Cllr Crossland left in order for the allotments to be discussed. I apologised to the Meeting that my "report" had not been more business like I did not realise it was to be presented to the Meeting. The Chairman stated "I could not sit on a report like that", this quite frankly startled me as it was really intended as a discussion document and had been presented to her along with copies of facsimile messages sent to me by Mr Crossland confirming discussions held between himself and the Chairman (these messages were quite rightly addressed to me, although I had not attended the Meetings and my concern is that they were not discussed or reported on by the Chairman).

I honestly feel that the Chairman has placed herself in a very difficult situation by meeting the Contractor on his own. She is saying "I DID NOT SAY THAT" and quite frankly the Contractor is saying she did. Her personal difference with another Councillor is affecting the work of the Council and in my opinion her judgement. I am concerned if this Contractor leaves the site whether we have any one willing to take the job on and of course costs must be a consideration., This matter has been rolling on since November 1998

Now to the point that really concerned me - at the close of the Meeting Councillor Allerston said "Ah well Mrs Bath we don't really blame you for the allotments". I realised at a similarly conducted Meeting, I would not have a "leg to stand on" and no Clerk should be put in that situation, i.e if the Chairman had said black is blue the "majority" would have agreed.

I am concerned about the Chairman's interpretation of legislation - at the end of the day this legislation has been tried and tested over the years but is in place to protect the Councillors and of course the public.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 4.10.99.

Most matters have been dealt with under "Matters Arising".

There is one matter which I feel should be of concern to all Members of Council, that is, the lack of consultation with Parish Councils in respect of the Planning Application for a new Court House on the Town Hall site in Bridlington.

I have not met anyone in either Flamborough or Bridlington who is happy with building it on the Town Hall site, especially when there are a number of derelict sites that could have been used.

I have been told alternative sites were looked at but the Contractors said they were unsuitable. As private funding was available it was decided the Town Hall site was recommended.

My concern is the lack of consultation with all the Parish Councils in the Bridlington area. Parish Councils opinion is sought in respect of Planning Applications, local maybe - but also on conservation, an area which stretches right to Sledmere - Our Representative on the Conservation Committee can, if he wishes, take part in decisions and discussions within that wide area - yet an important issue of a new Court House which affects the whole of the Bridlington area is decided by the majority of Councillors who do not come from the Bridlington area.

Councillors Allerton and Wilkinson have already expressed their concern at the decision to use the Town Hall site even though this is contrary to the wishes of the people.

I had a telephone call on Friday morning from the District Auditor. He is concerned about Members "Declaration of Interest." I explained the procedure we have put in place for the Clerk to read a statement at the start of every meeting.

He also asked how Quotes/Contracts are dealt with. I explained all large or small are advertised in the Parish Notice Board. He also asked if we had a list of approved contractors to invite for quotes.

He was satisfied with my explanation.

I discussed the matter with the responsible Officer on E.R.Y.C. He thought the signs may be enforced by the Authorities own Officers or that the Council could make an order to make it possible for the Police to enforce - he thought the ignoring of the present signs a dangerous practice and not a good example to other road users. He promised to look into the matter. The Officer returned my call as promised - on making enquiries for an order to allow Police enforcement he had been told proposals to alter the exit and entry roads into Danes Dyke were under consideration, he would keep the Council informed.

Allotments. A leak was found on the Allotments water system, on the surface it did not look very serious but it did entail digging up and relaying a section of pipe plus new fittings. The repair was done by Mr. John Robson (Chairman of Allotments Assocn.) The Council is very fortunate in being able to depend on Mr. Robson for dealing with some of the repairs which crop up now and again.

Standing Orders are not always straightforward and easy to interpret. I would like to suggest that Members consider the formation of a small sub-committee with an invitation to Sheena Spence (Parish Councils Assocn.) to read them with a view to amending sections which seem to cause problems on interpretation.

As this is a very important day for the village it would be nice this year if there could be better representation from the Parish Council which has an important role to play - the number of loved ones who gave their lives is getting smaller but that does not excuse us from showing our respect and gratitude to those who gave their lives for our freedom today.
