

Flamborough Head, Selwicks Bay and Lighthouse

Follow the B1259 from Flamborough Village, signposted to the Lighthouse and the road winds up to the head. You can take in spectacular views across the fields and golf course to the cliffs and Lighthouse. You will find Headlands Café and shop, Cliff End Café, toilet facilities and a car park (pay and display). The Lighthouses and fog signal station are located here.



Access to Selwicks Bay is via a path and steps and there are ample rocks, caves and beach.

There are scenic cliff walks – to the north to North Landing and to the south to South Landing.

There are two Lighthouses – the “old” and the “new”. See the section on the Lighthouses for more details – trips around both are available during high season.

The area is rich in geology and a heaven for geographers (see the “blow hole” for example) – the headland is the most northerly outcrop of chalk in the British Isles.
