19/19 Public Participation Session (15 minutes):

To include attendance by Inspector Rob Cocker, Humberside Police

A member of the Residents' Association – wished to send condolences to the family of Ward Councillor Richard Harrap. He also outlined the purpose of the Residents' Association which was to object to planning applications and support community groups. He explained their objections to the Bourne Leisure planning applications on the Haven site at Thornwick.

A resident – wished the Parish Council to contact the bus company with a view to them increasing the number and times of buses especially to North Landing. The resident thought that enough money would be made during the summer to extend times at night and in the winter.

PCSO Liz Smith – reported that:

- There had been no reported of anti-social behaviour.
- There had been concerns about a person setting fire to a chair on the Cricket Field which will be monitored.
- Speeding – she reported that Sgt Morris will come up on Friday with a pro-laser and issue tickets on North Marine Road – he will come up when he can.

Inspector Rob Cocker, Humberside Police – reported that

- Pro-laser is used by rural communities for speeding. A survey had been done by ERYC and the results were used to inform the Camera Safety Unit. A speeding seminar looked at funding from them to do projects such as purchasing mobile display boards to monitor traffic flow and speeders. Only PCs can use the pro-lasers. Speed boards can be used by PCSOs.

A resident – reported that ERYC did checks about 3 years ago on Lighthouse Road, North Marine Road and Crofts Hill. Only Crofts Hill warranted action as the other two areas were under the numbers for action. ERYC had sent this to the Police for action. However North Marine Road was the problem.

Councillor Crossland – reported the problem of the single yellow line on the brow of the hill at North Marine Road at seasonal times. The Parish Council had asked ERYC for years to look at this and they had said it is going ahead.

Councillor Crossland – reported complaints about noise outside the pubs in the early hours of the morning. Inspector Cocker reported that the Licensing Officer had visited a few times. There had not been any calls to the Police for service though.

Inspector Cocker – reported that he had met with the Assistant Chief Constable this week and staffing levels were being assessed and he was hopeful of an increase in staffing and an increase in beat managers and PCs. New student officers had started. He urged anyone who has a problem to ring us, for example regarding the pub noise. He reported on wildlife crime which is a persistent problem in this area and reports are increasing.

Councillor Sexton – reported a lack of confidence because the public do not have sight of the police. Inspector Cocker reported that he had to put his resources where the major problems are – for example the problem with drugs in Bridlington. Gone are the days where PCs are on the beat.

Councillor Crossland – reported that the past NATs or LATs were a good thing. Inspector Cocker stated that there used to be Community Partnership meetings which were attended by all services and the NHS however ERYC had made the decision to stop it because of budget cuts. It would be worth contacting the Ward Councillors to ask if they could be commenced again.

The Police and Councillor Sexton left the meeting

To note that there is no evidence of any audit work – noted and arrangements had been made for the audits to be undertaken.

26/19 To consider the recruitment process for a new Clerk/RFO:

The Chairman asked if anyone had any details from the previous appointment. Mr Morton had some documents which he gave back to the Council. This was deferred to the end of the meeting due to the confidential nature of the business.

27/19 To consider the following request from David Morton:

“The refurbishment of Fishermans Gardens is now complete. A water supply was created close to the site by Councillors at no expense to the community to enable regular watering of this outstanding asset to the village centre. Mr Morton had volunteered to supply water and to water the planters as necessary to maintain them. This cannot now be done as he no longer has the protection of Parish Council insurance. It is essential that this task is carried out immediately and regularly to ensure survival of the expensive new plants. The last watering was about 26th April. Please ask Council to resolve this matter. I would also suggest that the planters and contents be added to the Asset Register and Ground Works contract amended to reflect the future maintenance costs which will be greater than previously”

The Council will consider planting the village planters at June’s meeting.

RESOLVED: that the Small Works Contractor be asked to water the Fishermans Gardens planters as and when in the interim until the next meeting.

28/19 Allotments: To note any allotment report:

Councillor Taylor reported on the allotments from the previous Council in the absence of any Clerk’s report.

MR & KM Couzens will be asked to spray or cut vacant plots in accordance with the contract.
